
What type of Industrial Design is registered in Brunei?


There are many varieties of industrial designs registered, such examples are bottle designs, car designs, patterns on textiles, etc.

INDUSTRIAL DESIGN

What is an Industrial Design?

It is the features of shape, configuration, pattern or ornament which, when applied to an article, gives the article a unique appearance.

Industrial designs are applied to a wide variety of products of industry and handicraft; technical and medical instruments; watches, jewelry and other luxury items; house wares and electrical appliances; vehicles and architectural structures as well as textile designs and leisure goods.

It does not include a method or principle of construction.




Why do we protect Industrial Design?

It provides the owner an exclusive right to prevent unauthorized exploitation of the industrial design in the industrial article. Further, it makes a product attractive and appealing which can add to the commercial value of a product.

What industrial designs can be registered in Brunei?

- The industrial design must be new.
- The industrial design must apply to an article by an industrial process.
- The industrial design must have an eye-appeal.



Can one or more Industrial Designs be included in an application?

Yes, provided the industrial designs relate to the same class of product as classified under the Locarno Classification, or to the same set of products. A set of product means 2 or more product of the same or similar design and the same general character that are usually sold together or intended to be used together, for example a tea set.



How long is an Industrial Design protected?

A registered industrial design is protected for a period of 5 years beginning from the filing date and can be renewed for a further period of 10 years upon payment of a renewal fee, which is payable every 5 years.



Is a registered design protected worldwide?

No, as industrial design protection is territorial and is only valid in the country where it is registered.

However, as Brunei Darussalam is a party to the Hague Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Industrial Designs, it is possible to protect your industrial design in multiple countries by filing via the Hague route.
